# Ready to Achieve Plan 2023-2024

Our administrators have been working on detailed plans for reopening schools and providing educational services this fall using the Louisiana Department of Education's Guidelines. Lincoln Preparatory School is committed to helping our students and employees meet the academic and well-being needs of all students and address the disproportionate impact of COVID-19 on certain subgroups of students through key investments in evidence-based activities and Louisiana Comeback Commitments.

#### **Student Instruction**

Instruction will be in-person unless a student meets the criteria for temporary homebound services. Temporary homebound instruction will be provided by the Imagine Learning Edgenuity platform. If a student is placed on homebound instruction, the student must remain homebound for a minimum of four weeks. (Medical documentation is required and must accompany the application.)

Masks are optional for all students in grades Pre-K-12. Students will be required to wash their hands and sanitize often during the day. Students should bring a water bottle with water to drink during the day. Water fountains will be open to refill students' water bottles. Students will be responsible for missed work when absent, quarantined due to exposure, or isolating to testing positive, and should access their teachers' Google Classrooms for information.

## **Wellness and Policy**

Students who are ill should stay home regardless of symptoms. All Covid-19 symptoms should be monitored closely. Fever of 100.4 requires students to stay home or be picked up from school.

### **Positive Test Policy**

Students who test positive for Covid-19 or those who are symptomatic and choose not to test will be required to isolate at home for 10 days from the onset of symptoms and may return after the 10 days if free of fever for 24 hours and symptoms have improved
